Les was the foreman of the engineering and maintenance dept of Gisborne Hospital, approximately 7 staff in that dept

He was known to be very particular.

## Responsible for:

- kitchen maintenance
- water treatment plant
- monitoring of the city water supply
- adjustable beds in all wards
- hospital water boiler plant /heating
- CSSD unit which sterilizes all the instruments there is no room for error
- Les was responsible for the store room spare parts they were meticulously labelled so that they could be found quickly. This was important because any breakdown had to be attended to immediately

He was also a stalwart for the Save the Children Gisborne wide collection - a time consuming role
